The honey bee went down the path. And Pooh went down the path, too.


The honey bee went into the wood. And Pooh went into the wood, too.












The honey bee went up the big tree. And Pooh went up the big tree, too.

Read it yourself is a series of graded readers designed to give young children a confident and successful start to reading.



Unknown words can be worked out by looking at the beginning letter (what sound does this letter make?), and deciding which word would make sense. Beginner readers need plenty of encouragement.
