...and it turned to gold.

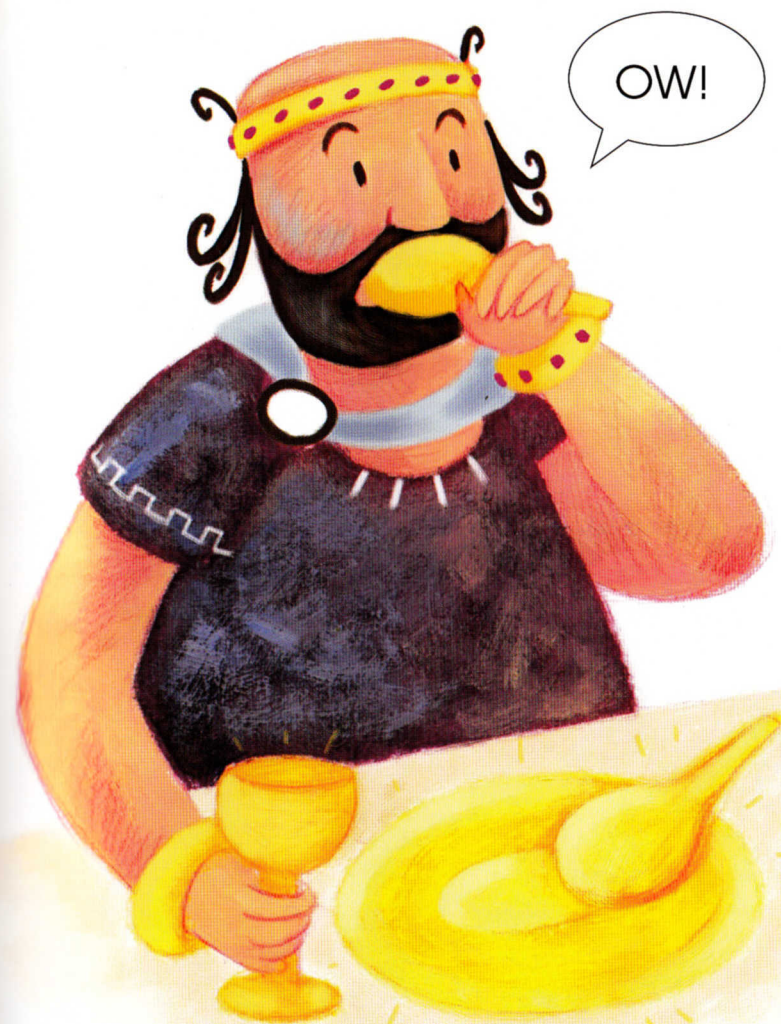




He touched his dinner...

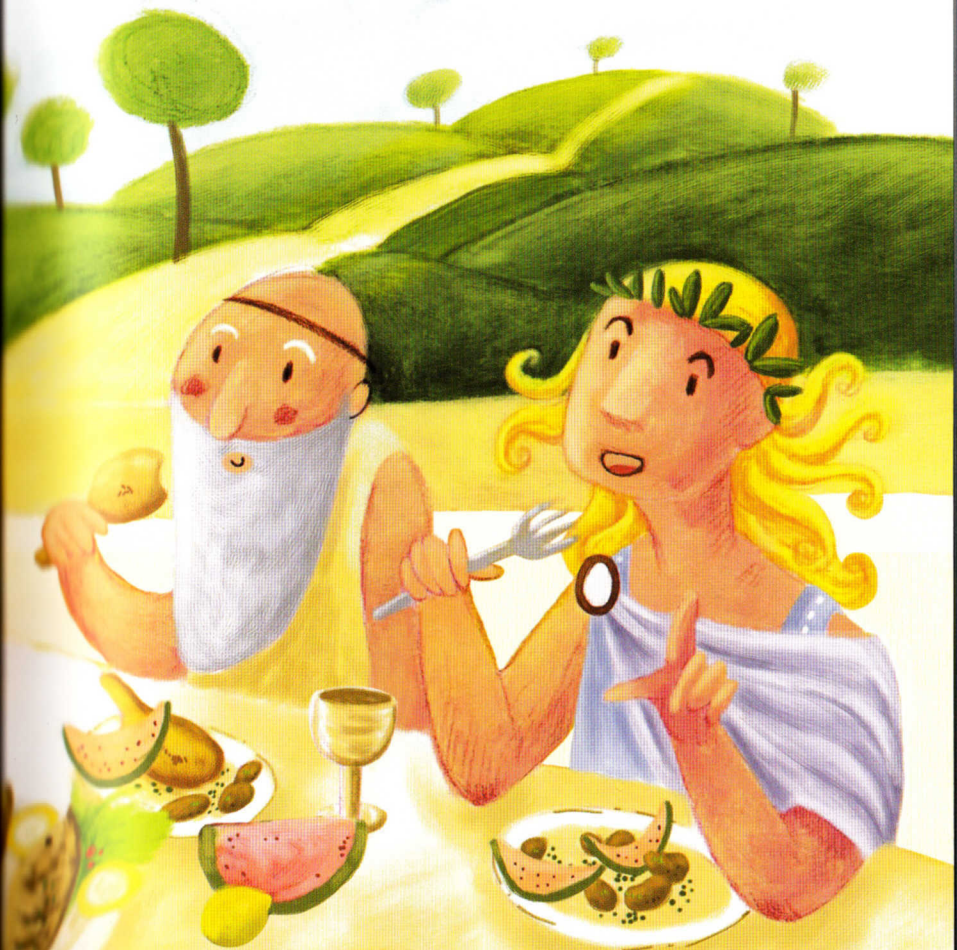


...and that turned to gold, too.

yourself in it.”

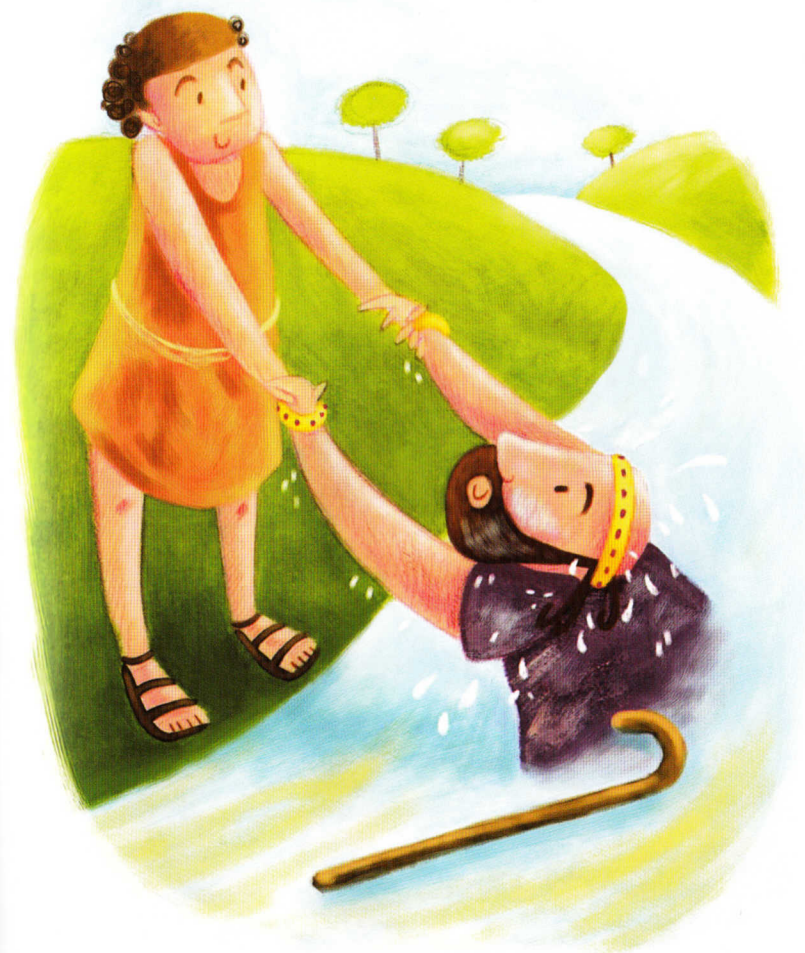


Midas walked a very
