shook below them.

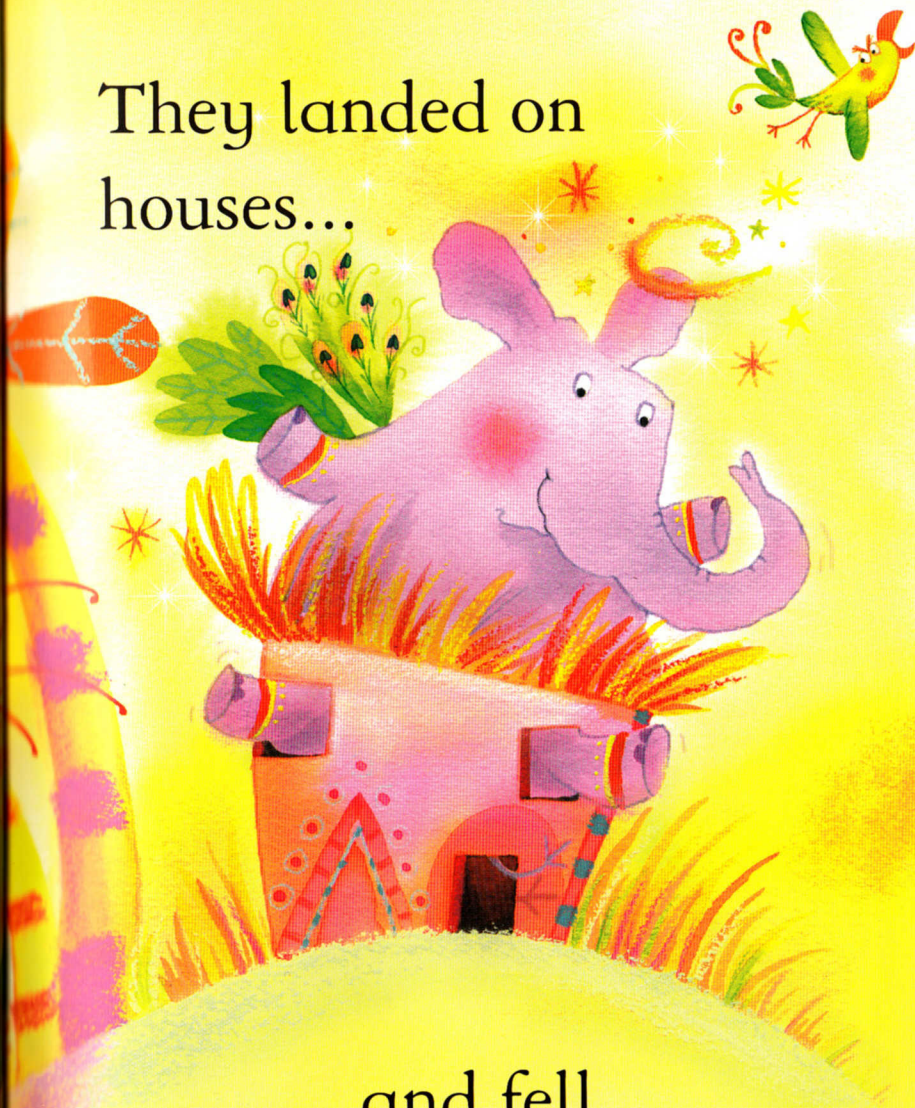
