


There are puzzles after the story, and for these you may need to read the instructions to your child.

Guidance notes

Usborne Very First Reading is a series of books, specially developed for children who are learning to read. Mr. Mystery is the fifteenth book in the series, and by this stage your child should be able to read the story alone, with occasional help from you.

The story of **Mr. Mystery** introduces the following spelling and pronunciation patterns:



It also gives your child practice in reading longer words (three or four syllables). If your child can read the story comfortably, they are well on the way to independent reading.

Some questions and answers

- Why do I need to read with my child? Sharing stories makes reading an enjoyable and fun activity for children. It also helps them to develop confidence and stamina. Even if you are not taking an active part in reading, your listening and support are very important.
- When is a good time to read?
 Choose a time when you are both relaxed, but not too tired, and there are no distractions.
 Only read for as long as your child wants to you can always try again another day.
- What if my child gets stuck?
 Don't simply read the problem word yourself,
 but prompt your child and try to find the right answer together. Similarly, if your child makes a mistake, go back and look at the word together. Don't forget to give plenty of praise and encouragement.
- We've finished, now what do we do?

 It's a good idea to read the story several times to give your child more practice and more confidence. Once you are ready to move on, your child might enjoy choosing from the many titles in the Usborne First Reading series.
