



Talk together

Ask the child to

- Point to the letters in the box on the back cover and say the sound (not letter name) that each letter usually makes in words (e.g. y as in yum). Tell the child each letter sound if necessary.
- Look out for these letters in the story and try and remember the sound they make.

Read the story

Remember, children learn best when reading is relaxed and enjoyable so give lots of praise.

- Encourage the child to point at the words and try to read any he/she does not recognise by saying the individual sounds separately (e.g. y u m), then running the sounds together quickly. If the child finds it difficult to say the sounds, say the sounds first for the child and see if he/she can hear the word.
- On page 4 help the child to read the longer words by breaking them up into smaller parts (eg lemon, lem on), and then sounding out the smaller parts and blending the sounds together (e.g. l e m, lem, o n, on, lemon).
- On pages 7 and 8, if the child has difficulty reading the word says, read
 it for the child. Explain that it is important when running the sounds in a
 word together to check to see if it sounds like a real word as some words
 are less regular.


Bob cuts up a bun.




Bob tips in a pot of jam.




Bob cuts up a lemon, a melon and a fig.

Check comprehension

Ask the child

- Why do you think Bob rubs his tum?
- What are some of the things Bob puts in his pan? (bun, jam, lemon, melon, a fig, nuts)
- Would you like to taste his mixture? Why?

Check phonics (letter-pattern sounds)

Ask the child to

- Find a word in the book which ends with the letter x (mix). Point to the middle letter in this word and say the sound it makes.
- Find some words in the book which have an *i* sound in them (*big, tins, tips, in, fig, his*).
- Try and write the word *tins*. Say all the sound in the word separately then write the letter that makes each sound. Look in the book to check.
