shakes the wall.





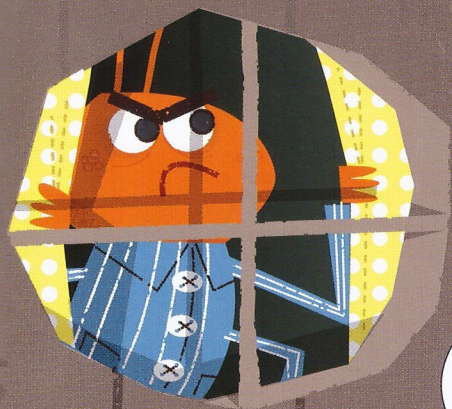
Below, a baby starts to bawl.

but all too soon...

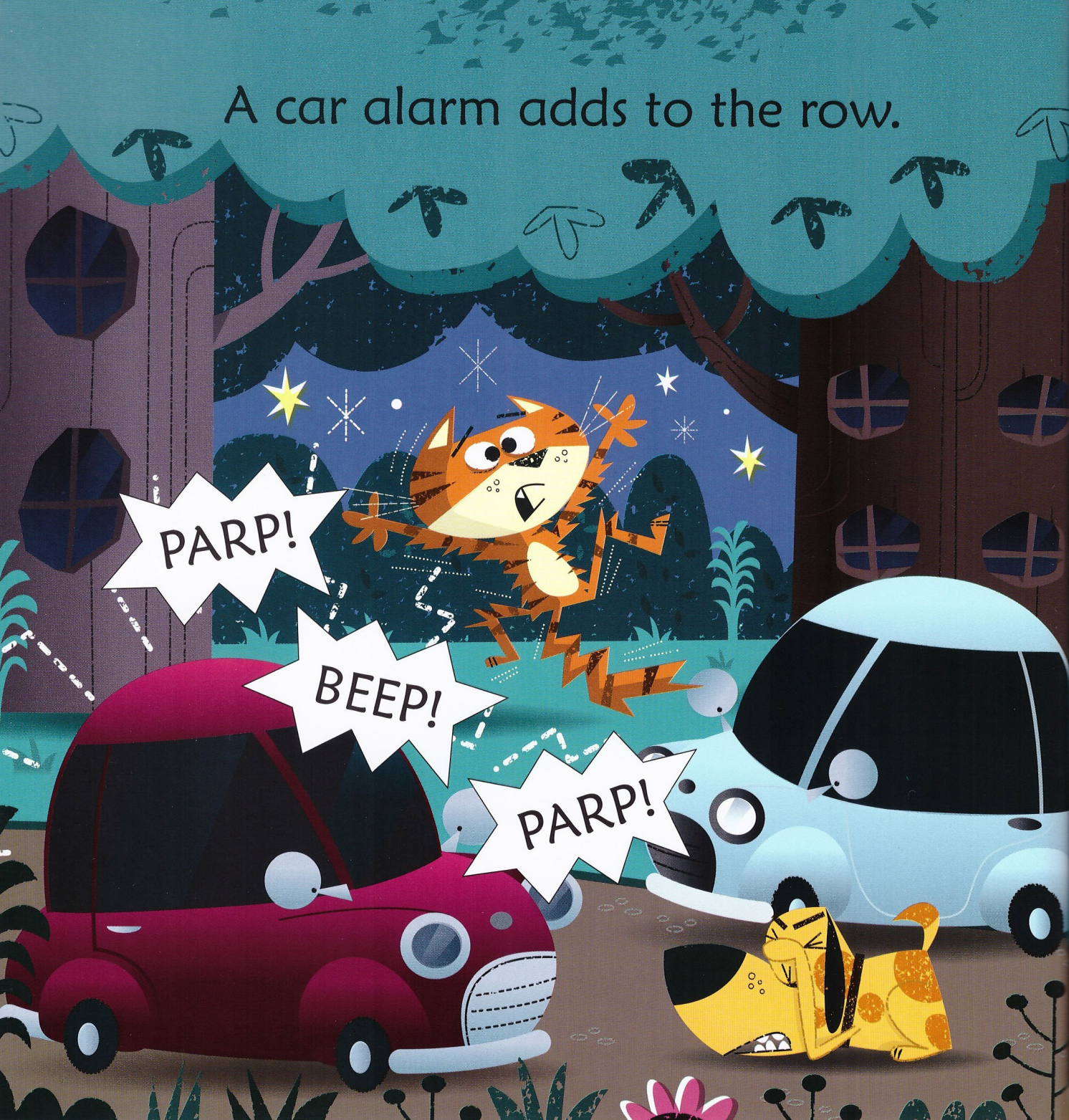
Owl is hooting
